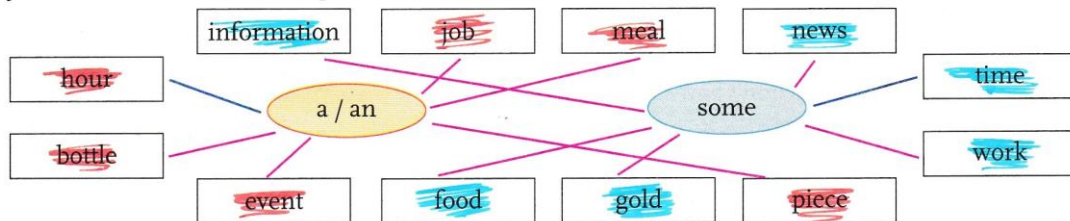


Dear girls & boys, please find the **solutions** of last week's work (24th – 27th March) enclosed. Stay healthy!
